Philos 1 (Introduction to Philosophy): A selection of philosophical problems, concepts, and methods, e.g., free will, cause and substance, personal identity, the nature of philosophy itself. Materials fee. (IV)

Philos 2 (Puzzles & Paradoxes): Introduction to the formal tools needed to comprehend and evaluate philosophical arguments and theoretical reasoning in general. (IV and VB)

Philos 3 (Tech & Society): A study of the nature of technology, its relation to human values, the philosophical assumptions in its development, and the philosophical implications of technology. (II)

Philos 4 (Intro to Ethics): Selected topics from the history of ethics, e.g., the nature of the good life and the moral justification of conduct. (IV)

Philos 131C (Medical Ethics): Analysis of moral issues concerning health care. Topics may include just allocation of scarce medical resources, the doctor/patient relationship, genetic engineering, surrogate motherhood, abortion, euthanasia, or social policy concerning AIDS.

Philos 133 (Lawyers and Liars): Selected topics concerning legal systems and the concept of law, e.g., the nature and purpose of law, the nature of authority, the relationship between law and morality, law and political-economic systems. Repeatability: Unlimited as topics vary.
